

This week the children have taken part in a variety of activities. On Monday we had our Remembrance service at Northlew Church. The children read their own poetry and prayers they had created and the whole school conducted themselves beautifully through our two minute silence. A massive thank you to our Governor Marilyn Livingstone for leading the service and to those parents who came along. The children's prayers are displayed in the front lobby if you would like to read them.

This week the children wore their odd socks to encourage children to be kind and accepting of each other's differences and of themselves. On Thursday we had a visit from the NSPCC who carried out workshops with the children with a focus on 'Speaking Out & Staying Safe'. We hope to display what the children have learnt from these experiences in the school hall shortly.

We watched two live performances this week, as class 2 went to Okehampton College on Monday to watch the students perform their version of 'Oliver'. On Wednesday the whole school along with Boasley Cross, watched Theatre Alibi's adaptation of Michael Morpurgo's 'I Believe in Unicorns' in the village hall. The children were mesmerized throughout the performance and the characters really brought the story to life. We hope this has



given the children some inspiration for our own auditions for our school Christmas performance this week; we will be giving out scripts and parts on Friday afternoon. We hope to have Theatre Albi back at school next year with another fantastic performance. A big thank you to those parents who came along to our first phonics group meeting last week. These happen every Friday at 2:30pm in our school and are a great way of finding out how to support your child with reading, writing and spelling. Please come along and join us, everyone is welcome.

As the weather turns cold, please can I ask that children come to school with a warm coat. If the weather is bad we ask that parents drop off and collect their children to and from the front of the school to save everyone from getting wet. ## **QUESTION OF THE WEEK**


Do you think the friendships in our school are strong?
