

Dear parents/carers,

As you are probably aware, we have had a positive Covid test result in one of our Moorland Hub Schools. To ensure the safety of all our children, staff and the wider community, we agreed that we should close the school following guidance from Public Health England. We have asked all staff and children to self-isolate and complete a PCR test to prevent the spread of further infection.

Due to the rising number of cases across Devon and Cornwall, we continuing to review our health and safety measures in school. We are reminding all parents to stick to the two-metre distancing rule when dropping off and picking up their children at the end of the day. Can we also ask that parents wear a face covering when dropping off and picking up from school until the end of the summer term.

Next week, we will be saying goodbye to our teaching assistant in class 2 Mrs Walter. Mrs Walter has chosen to finish her teaching position with Northlew to enable her to focus on her family and new grandchild due soon. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Walter for all her hard work and dedication to the children, staff and community of Northlew and wish her all the best for the future.
