Year 6 Junior Life Skills at Parklands

On Tuesday this week, our year 6 children took part in a junior life skills workshop morning. The workshops gave them the opportunity to find out information about a variety of different life skills and carry out some practical activities to really get the children thinking about a particular aspect.
