Dartmoor Federation Primaries PE and Sports Premium Strategy **2017-18**

Between 2013 and 2020, the Government has committed to spend £450 million on improving PE teaching and sport in primary schools. This funding is being allocated directly to schools in the form of a PE & Sport Premium, which can be spent on a range of activities such as:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with teachers during PE lessons
- Providing resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- Running sport competitions and sport activities with other schools
- Enhancing playgrounds and improving children's physical activity at break and lunchtimes
- Extending opportunities for children to participate in PE and sport by running after-school and holiday sports clubs for pupils.

This year, schools with 17 or more pupils on roll receive £16,000 plus £100 per pupil per year.

Schools are accountable for how they spend their PE and sports grant and must publish on their website, details of how the money is spent and the impact this funding has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment.

Identified Barriers to Participation and Achievement

The Dartmoor Federation Primaries have identified the following barriers for some of our pupils, which forms the rationale for the planned expenditure of the PE Sports Premium:

- Child confidence
- Low aspirations concerning health and opportunities
- Lack of adult role models
- Lack of active lifestyle from home
- Time spent on electronic devices
- SEND/PP
- Transportation
- Lack of space and infrastructure
