Make a no-sew bunny

- Ping pong ball toss:

Use varying paper tubes in heights and use painter's tape to tape down the floor or you can even insert them on top of a cardboard box and hot glue down. Place foil over the opening and ping pong balls on top so they don't fall down.

Tip: If you have large coloured plastic balls you don't need the foil. Use a ball or make your own (we crumpled a piece of leftover foil!) to knock down the balls. Or if you have a Nerf Gun, you can use that too.



Take two paper tubes and tape to the floor. Give each kid a straw and do a ping pong ball race! If the ping pong is too easy to blow, use a heavier ball or object. Test out different ones - the experimentation in creating different variations of games is also fun!

History:

British Museum

This one takes a bit of work as there is so much to look at. Toggle the bar on the right to look at different aspects of history and then you can also click on the grey circles and some of those will open new items also. I have looked at some of the awesome Aztec materials, including a designed sacrificial knife but you can look through any period of time.
