

Dear Parent/Carer

If your child is having to self-isolate at home due to the Coronavirus, we are continuing to provide education for your child.

Please see the attached home learning tasks for your child to complete this week:

- Reading (minimum 20 minutes per day), please record this in your child's reading record book
 - 5 hours of English across the week, please record this on the weekly timetable
 - 5 hours of Maths across the week, please record this on the weekly timetable
 - Wider curriculum tasks at least 3 per week, please record this on the weekly timetable
 - Please supplement with online learning and record this as part of your child's learning timetable
 - Please refer to the school website where there will support materials for your children to access. **This can be found under the parents tab - children - home learning - Covid 19 home learning.**
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- Please email completed learning to the admin email address at the end of each day, it will then be forwarded to your class teacher. (this can be done by photo or scan).
 - Please complete the learning timetable at the end of the week to inform your class teacher of what learning you have completed (**this can be found within the Covid-19 home learning page of our website at www.northlew.devon.sch.uk**).

English tasks

Class 1

- Read a book and write a description about a character from the story
- Create a home for a particular character from a story you have read with lego or other cardboard etc. Can you label the different parts of your new home and take a photo?
- Following our story about Mrs Armitage and the big wave (this story can be found on you tube), can you think of another setting that Mrs Armitage could go on her bike. What things might she collect? Can you draw a picture and list the objects she would fetch?
- Practice reading, writing and spelling HIGH FREQUENCY WORDS from the list inside your work book. Can you put these words into sentences and record this in your book? Just practice a small group of words each time
- Help a grown up to make lunch or dinner. Can you record instructions about what you did for someone else to follow?
- Hide a teddy or toy somewhere in your house. Write a set of instructions for someone else to follow. See if they can use your instructions to find the hidden toy.
- Watch <https://www.literacyshed.com/partly-cloudy.html> . Can you make a list of all the different animals that the cloud makes for the stork and record these in your book. Can you draw a new animal that the cloud makes. What do you think might happen to the stork? Can you write some sentences to describe what will happen.
- Can you keep a diary entry of what you are doing at home and record your sentences in your book.

Maths tasks

Class 1

- Using a pack of playing cards play a range of games - snap for number recognition, select two cards and practice your addition calculations, select the 2, 3, 5 and 10 cards from the pack and practice your times tables by choosing a card from the rest of the pack. Record these calculations in your book.
- Find objects around your home and look at what they weigh. Record the weight of each item. Can you put these in order from the heaviest to the lightest objects?
- Can you find any arrays around your home and take photographs of these and put them in your book.

- Using a clock at home can you practice telling the time - using o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to the hour. Time how long you are reading, getting dressed, eating dinner etc and record this in your books.
- Complete a jigsaw puzzle and take a photograph for your book.
- Create an imaginary shopping list and price tags for each item. Write some problems for everyone to solve? Set up a shop at home and play with other members of your family.

Wider curriculum tasks

Class 1

- Watch a video clip of the Easter story https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bkNTU_Vv5Ew.
- Can you create some pictures to retell the story and include some sentences to explain your pictures.
- Create an Easter poem in your book and decorate it.
- Look at deadly 60 video clips on line. Can you draw an animal that you have watched and create a fact file for that animal? Try to include what the animal eats and how it hunts, where it lives, what does it look like and any special features it may have.
- Explore food chains of animals. Can you see any of these food chains happening in your garden? Draw and label these food chains in your books.
- Can you label body parts on a teddy or doll at home? Which parts can you remember, can you spell these words correctly? Take a picture to put in your book.
- Read some books on different animals and tell a family member three facts about the animal you have read about.
- Following our topic on explorers can you find out some information about famous explorers who went to space. Can you find out their names and when they travelled to space. What did they discover and how did they travel there? What were their difficulties and how did they overcome this? Record your ideas in your book.
- Make a space rocket out of junk or lego etc. Take a photo and put it in your book.
- Create a small world play with your toys and pretend you are going off to space. What will you take with you and what will happen on the way? Get a grown up to take pictures of you with your toys.
