

build toilets in countries which don't have toilets for miles.

At the end of the day, we read out a passage of our books to the school and we could tell everyone why we chose that as our favourite book. We asked for a donation of £1 to be given for dressing up and all the money we raised went to children without books to read, so all the money that was given will help to fund children without books. The School Council will be working with the Librarians to make reading more interesting for pupils.

On the same day (Thursday 7th March) we held a bake sale. The money raised from this is to support toilet twinning. We will be looking at some more fundraising activities to support this as we will need to raise £60 to sponsor a toilet in a country which the children pick.
